


Continuous Cursive Style

In the early stages of handwriting development, children participate in activities that introduce patterns that will eventually build to letter formation.

The order of patterning is as follows and these will be taught through fun, multi-sensory activities both in Nursery and Reception.




Through Reception and into Key Stage 1 and 2, children progress onto the cursive handwriting style. This style teaches pupils to join letters in words as a series of continuous flowing movements or patterns.

The style is quick and easy to learn, particularly following on from the patterning skills learnt in the Early Years Foundation Stage. The final product is neat and fast.

Letter formation

All letters start on the line and go 'up the slide'.
